

TIME FOR SPRING

Spring is the time of year that brings new promises, that gives us hope and the impulse to start new activities such as: learning something new (a foreign language or cooking), reading a motivational book, hanging out with some friends while going to the cinema or to a concert. Spring is also the time when we can start doing something to protect the environment by planting some trees or by simply recycling our waste papers or batteries. Spring is the time for celebration: Easter, Mother's Day, Arbour Day and many other festive days take place in spring.

Before spring was called spring, it was called Lent in Old English. Starting in the 14th century, that time of year was called “springing time”—a reference to plants “springing” from the ground. In the 15th century this got shortened to “spring-time”, and then further shortened in the 16th century to just “spring.”

The first spring flowers are typically dandelions, daffodils, lilacs, lilies, iris and tulips to name a few.

Holidays that occur in spring include Easter, Passover, April Fool's Day, Earth Day, Arbour Day, Mother's Day, and Holi (festival of colours in India).

The most important celebration of spring is Easter.



What is Easter?

In Christian countries Easter is celebrated as the religious holiday marking the resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

From the History of Easter

Today Easter is one of the most beautiful religious holidays. People celebrate it according to their beliefs and their religious denominations. Christians commemorate Good Friday as the day when Jesus Christ died and Easter Sunday as the day when He was resurrected.

The celebration takes its name and many of its customs and symbols from a festival called Eostre. Eostre was the Anglo-Saxon goddess of spring who got her name from the word “east”, where the sun rises. Every spring northern European peoples celebrated the festival of Eostre to greet the coming of new life in nature. Later Christians related the rising of the sun to the resurrection of Jesus and their own spiritual rebirth.

According to Bede, the English monastic historian, the English word Easter comes from the Anglo-Saxon name for the month of April, which was known as "Eostremonath".



Easter Symbols

Easter celebrates the resurrection of Jesus but it is also associated with popular symbols such as **eggs, candy, bunnies and food**. Every symbol of Easter has its own significance, if one symbolizes purity, the other represents new life.



Easter eggs & baby chicks-

Eggs and chicks symbolize new life. Eggs have been a symbol of spring since ancient times. The custom of giving and receiving eggs at Easter is very common as the egg is a symbol of new life and Easter is the time of the resurrection of life.

Easter bunny - The rabbit, or hare, was a symbol of abundant new life in ancient times, and reminds us of spring and new life.



The Lamb - The symbol of the lamb is strongly rooted in Christian belief. One of the most important symbols of Easter, the lamb signifies the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.

Easter Lilies- The white blossoms symbolize the purity of Jesus. Lilies, emerging from the earth in the spring, also symbolize new life and the resurrection of Christ.

Easter Colours

All the colours of Easter have their own unique significance.

RED: this colour is associated with the blood that Jesus Christ had shed for mankind. Thus the colour red is a symbol of love and sacrifice for humanity.

WHITE: this Easter colour signifies purity and grace.

GREEN: the colour green brings ray of hope. Green is the colour of grass.

PURPLE: Easter colour purple is indicative of royalty. It is said that the colour purple brings wealth.

YELLOW: it is the colour that is related to the brightness of sun. It's a colour that brings joy and happiness.

ORANGE: it is the colour that represents hope. It is associated with the dawn of day.

Facts About Easter

- * The first Easter baskets were made to look like bird's nests.
- * The custom of giving eggs at Easter time has been traced back to Egyptians, Persians, Gauls, Greeks and Romans, to whom the egg was a symbol of life.
- * The traditional act of painting eggs is called Pysanka (origins from the Ukrainian word *pysaty*, "to write")
- * The first chocolate eggs were made in Europe in the early 1800s and still are one of the most popular treats associated with Easter.
- * The most famous decorated Easter eggs were those made by the well-known

goldsmith, Peter Carl Faberge. In 1883 the Russian Czar, Alexander, commissioned Faberge to make a special Easter gift for his wife, the Empress Marie. The first Faberge egg was an egg within an egg. In later years Nicholas II, Alexander's son, continued the custom. Fifty-seven eggs were made in all.

* The original date of Easter was first fixed in 325AD.

Easter in Romania

Easter in Romania is celebrated according to the rituals of the Eastern Orthodox Church. The Friday before the Easter is called the Great Friday or the Friday of sufferings, as it is the day when Jesus was crucified. On Saturday, people go to church for the midnight mass, taking with them a bowl of Pasca, eggs and steak, to be blessed by the clergy. On returning home from the mass, people first eat some of the blessed Pasca and only then they rest.



Easter traditions in the UK



There are lots of Easter traditions in the UK. Morris Dancing is one of the more unusual traditions which involves people dressing up in bonnet hats, clogs, bells and ribbons; holding sticks whilst they perform their folk dance ritual.

Egg hunts are often organised for children. Brightly painted eggs are hidden around a park for example, and children have to find them and fill up their basket. They are told that the “Easter Bunny” has visited and hidden the eggs for them to find. A little bit like the Tooth Fairy, or Father Christmas, the Easter Bunny is the symbol of this particular season.
